- 2. decline the request from the Mudgee Region MudDragons Dragonboat Club for a shed to be constructed at the Mudgee Pool complex.

## **Executive summary**

Council has received a request from the Mudgee Region MudDragons Dragonboat Club for a small shed to be constructed at the Mudgee Pool complex to house equipment and materials. The Club have advised that they will pay for the cost of the shed.

## Detailed report

The Mudgee Region MudDragons Dragonboat Club have requested a small shed be constructed at the Mudgee Pool. It is noted that a small shed would likely have a minimal impact on the pool complex at this time and that it would be housed next to the location of one of the Club's boats.

The Club also have another boat and this is stored at Windamere Dam. It was the understanding of Council staff that most of the boating activity happens at Windamere Dam. When the issue of more infrastructure for the Club in Lawson Park was raised some years ago, the discussion seemed to be around focusing on Windamere for future activity.

If there was to be additional shedding in the Pool area, it would need to be constructed and secured securely the ensure safety for pool patrons. Again, while the shed would be small, there is limited space at the Pool and any additional infrastructure would impact at times.

Finally, Council is still considering its options in relation to a future indoor pool facility. If it was determined that this should proceed at the Mudgee Pool complex in the future, then the shed would need to be dismantled.

For these reasons, staff are recommending that permission not be given. However, it is presented to Council for consideration.
