# FESTIVE SHOPPING

# Residents are encouraged to shop local to boost the local economy.

As the holiday season approaches, residents are encouraged to embrace the spirit of Christmas by supporting local businesses while enjoying the festive atmosphere throughout the region.

Shopping locally goes beyond finding gifts — it's a chance to contribute to the local economy. Spending within the region directly supports the local businesses, helping sustain jobs, schools, and community groups. The impact extends across the community, creating a ripple effect that benefits us all.

In December 2023, local data revealed that \$76.9 million was

spent within the region, of that \$22.6 million was visitor spend underscoring the importance of shopping local.

This year, festive holiday decorations including Christmas trees, wreaths and garlands will be installed in Mudgee, Gulgong, Rylstone, and Kandos providing a joyful feel throughout the region.

In 2023 Council contributed \$200,000 towards festive decorations in response to community requests.

# INVESTING IN OUR COMMUNITY-CELEBRATING **COUNCIL ACHIEVEMENTS**

Mid-Western Regional Council is pleased to present highlights from the State of Our Region Report, capturing key achievements from the previous term of Council.

# ENHANCING PUBLIC SPACES AND ACCESSIBILITY

Council's commitment to accessible, enjoyable public spaces has delivered substantial upgrades across the region. The new Mudgee River Walk, extending along the Cudgegong River from Lawson Park to Putta Bucca, is a scenic trail designed for residents of all ages and abilities.

An all-new inclusive play space was built at the Rylstone Showground. The playground features an inclusive carousel, swings, a climbing tower with slides, flying fox, sensory play stations, nature play stations, shaded seating, and a picnic area, offering a fun and accessible environment for all children.



# PUTTA BUCCA WETLANDS

Putta Bucca Wetlands has been upgraded to enhance its appeal for residents, visitors, and school groups. New additions include a 68 metre boardwalk, picnic shelters, expanded parking, a sheltered barbecue area, and a native bee garden. These improvements not only provide greater opportunities for outdoor activity but also integrate the Wetlands into local school curriculums as an important educational resource, promoting environmental awareness and engagement with nature.

# **SMART WATER METERS**

Between 2019 and 2022, Council installed smart water meters in 9,000 connections across the region as part of a multi-year project aimed at reducing water wastage. Before these meters were introduced, up to 140 million litres of water were lost annually due to leaks. The new meters provide real-time data to the YourWater portal, enabling both Council and residents to monitor water usage more effectively.

Significant upgrades have been made to pedestrian pathways across the Mid-Western Region. Key improvements were made on Cudgegong Street in Rylstone, Rogers Street extending south toward Dabee Road in Kandos, Tallawang Street to Medley Street in Gulgong, Ulan Road Mudgee and Lions Drive Mudgee. These enhancements have substantially improved pedestrian access and safety in these areas.

# COUNCIL PROJECTS

Mid-Western Regional Council has initiated the budget planning process for the next financial year and is encouraging residents to participate by submitting proposals. Residents have the opportunity to present 'Community Plan Proposals' (CPPs) for consideration in the 2025/26 Operational Plan. Proposals can encompass new infrastructure, projects, activities, and region-wide improvements. The Operational Plan outlines Council's commitments for the upcoming financial year.

Additionally, it will provide information about measures and time lines to accomplish these projects. The plan will include critical elements such as the Council's Revenue Policy (including the Rating Model), proposed Fees and Charges for 2025/26, the Capital Works Program, Annual Budget, and Delivery Program. # **BY-ELECTION VOTING** CEMBER

Residents in the Mid-Western Regional Council Area will head to the polls on Saturday, 7 December, for a local government by-election. This election was called at Council's first meeting following the resignation of a sitting Councillor.

If you're enrolled address is within the Mid-Western Regional Council Area, voting in this by-election is compulsory. Voting options include pre-poll (early voting) at designated venues, in-person voting at polling places on election day, postal voting, and telephone-assisted voting for electors who are blind or have low vision.


