Australia Day Award recipients were honoured across seven categories at this year's celebrations in Gulgong.

A large crowd gathered for the official ceremony at Anzac Memorial Park, Gulgong. The achievements of local citizens were celebrated and honoured during the presentation, led by Mayor Des Kennedy and Australia Day Ambassador Joanne Taranto in celebration of outstanding residents.

Local charity volunteer Carol Jones was awarded the prestigious title of Citizen of the Year for her dedication to the community as President of the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. Carol works tirelessly as an advocate for people experiencing disadvantage within the region. Other recognised categories included Young Citizen of the Year (Grace Pearce), Community Event of the Year (Mudgee Lions Eye Health Programme for Children), Music and Arts (Tyrolin Puxty), Sports Person of the Year (Chelsea Mottershead), Volunteer Services Award (Lorraine Stewart) and the Wall of Reflections (David Bruce Lester).

During the ceremony new citizens also made a pledge of commitment and were presented with citizenship certificates, representing a shared dedication to the values that define the Australian way of life.

The 2026 Australia Day celebrations will be held in Rylstone.

COUNCIL ACHIEVEMENTS

Mid-Western Regional Council is pleased to present highlights from the State of Our Region Report, capturing key achievements from the previous term of Council.

CULTURAL WORKSHOPS BUILDING

The Cultural Workshops Building is part of the Mudgee Arts Precint and provides state-of-the-art facilities that support creative and educational pursuits within the community. Located close-by the main gallery and Mudgee Region Tourism, the Mudgee CBD, Sculpture Walk and Cudgegong River, the centre features a range of hireable spaces suitable for various activities. It includes a digital classroom and technical suite equipped with recording and editing facilities, large and small workshop areas, co-working spaces, a kitchenette and high-speed Wi-Fi.



BILLY DUNN OVAL GULGONG

This project involved the construction of new amenities at Gulgong's Billy Dunn Oval. The facility now includes female change rooms, toilets, showers, a referee's bathroom, and storeroom. These features help address the need for dedicated spaces for female players and enhance their experience and participation in local sports. This project was funded by Council and grant funding from the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund.

LED STREET LIGHT UPGRADES

Council has upgraded street lighting across the region, installing more energy efficient LED lights. This initiative helps to reduce Council's carbon footprint while delivering long-term cost savings for the community. Not only do these lights use less energy, they also have a longer lifespan. This means while reducing energy consumption and greenhouse emissions, there is reduced need for frequent replacements and minimised waste.



KANDOS AND RYLSTONE DOG PARKS

Rylstone and Kandos residents and their pets can now take advantage of off-leash dog areas. With its scenic backdrop on the Cudgegong River, the dog park in Rylstone is located at the showground, adjacent to the recently updated children's sensory playground. Meanwhile, the Kandos Dog Park is in Darton Park, with Mount Cumber Melon overlooking a secure, fenced

area that provides seating, shelter, and drinking water for dogs.

It's not too late to get tickets to the Charity Shield on Saturday, 22 February at Glen Willow Stadium. Thousands of fans are expected to make the trip to Mudgee to watch the South Sydney Rabbitohs and St George Illawarra Dragons battle it out.

Gates open from 12.30pm with the curtain raiser at 12.40pm, setting the stage for the main game at 3pm.

Attendees are encouraged to utilise the complimentary shuttle service available in Mudgee. Buses will make regular rounds, picking up and dropping off passengers in the CBD and West Mudgee starting at 12.15pm and concluding at 2.45pm. The bus service will recommence after the conclusion of the game from approximately 5.30pm. Buses will be operating from Gulgong, Rylstone, and Kandos. This service can be added when booking tickets.

General admission tickets start at \$28 for adults, \$18 for concession card holders, \$18 for juniors (5 - 15 years old) and \$80 for a family of four.

COUNCIL RECEIVES A CLEAN AUDIT OUTCOME

Council's Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2024 have been audited with positive results. The Financial Statements provide information regarding Council's financial performance and position. They are audited by the NSW Audit Office and are then sent to the NSW Office of Local Government.

The results of the audit were presented at the November meeting of Council by the NSW Audit Office and showed that Council performed well

against the relevant benchmarks for several key performance indicators. These include operating income, capacity to service loan borrowings, and the capacity to operate for more than three months from available funds.
