The eleventh annual Flavours of Mudgee is set to return on Saturday, 28 September.

Mudgee's flagship event will take place in the picturesque Mudgee CBD, along Church and Market Streets. Featuring local stall holders, this event showcases the finest food and wine the region has to offer.

Flavours of Mudgee is expected to draw a large crowd, including a significant number of visitors from outside the region. These visitors typically stay for 1-3 nights, providing a substantial boost to the local economy.

APPLICATIONS FOR

SOLID WOOD HEATERS

Residents who are considering installing a wood heater in their home are advised to seek approval prior to installation. Domestic combustion heaters and fire places must be approved and installed in accordance with the Local Government Act, to ensure safety and compliance.

Residents can submit their applications through the NSW Planning Portal. The application must include the manufacturer's installation instructions and a floor plan. Once the application is approved and installed, residents should contact Council to

schedule a final inspection.

Council's final inspection ensures that the installation complies with the Building Code of Australia and the manufacturer's specifications, safeguarding home occupants.

To lodge an application, residents are required to set up an account on the NSW Planning Portal, the application can be found under section 68 of the Local Government Act.
