LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS



Local government elections are being held on the second Saturday of this month, 14 September.

With local government elections just around the corner, it's important to remember the significant role the community plays in electing nine Councillor's for a four-year term.

On election day there will be multiple polling locations throughout the region, ensuring that every resident has ample opportunity to participate.

Pre-poll voting runs from Saturday, 7 September, to Friday, 13 September (excluding Sunday, 8 September).

Residents can visit the NSW Electoral Commission website at elections.nsw.gov.au to verify their enrolment and find the nearest polling station. For additional details, visit Council's website.

BIKE PUMP TRACK UPDATE

The new bike pump track at Glen Willow Sporting Complex is about to start construction and is expected to be completed by the end of 2024.

In late 2023 community members were invited to provide their feedback on two proposed concept designs for the bike pump track via an online survey and at an on-site consultation event. The design chosen has an area for younger children at the front of the park, and areas for intermediate and expert riders further behind.

The track will be located diagonally across from the Jennie Blackman Dog Park, and will be a hub for BMX enthusiasts and riders of all skill levels.

PUTTA BUCCA WETLANDS PROJECT

COMPLETED

In July, Council invited the community to celebrate the official grand opening of the Putta Bucca Wetlands Tourism and Community Infrastructure Development Project on Saturday, 20 July. The family-friendly event was a fun-filled day with a variety of free activities for all ages to enjoy.

On the day there were plenty of activities for children and families to participate in, including a scavenger hunt, nature walks, bird box painting and building, face painting, and a visit from Council's Library van.

The newly completed project at Putta Bucca Wetlands features a range of new amenities, including a boardwalk, picnic shelters, playground, native bee garden and upgraded car parking.

The Wetlands now feature 13 bird nest boxes and a bird hide, providing avian lovers with ideal locations to observe and enjoy the local bird life.

This significant development was made possible through joint funding from the Australian and NSW Government's Bushfire Local Economic Recovery Fund.

Mudgee pool is now open from 6 - 10am, 7 days a week, in response to community requests. This trial extension aims to provide access for early morning swimmers. Normal operating hours will resume at all pools in Mudgee, Gulgong and Rylstone starting on 27 September. Regular users of Council pools should consider purchasing a season pass, available on Council's website. Latest consumer expenditure data has revealed that 9.9 million transactions worth a record total \$827.6m were conducted in the Mid-Western Region by residents, businesses and visitors in 2023-24. This is an additional \$26.6m and approximately 370,000 more transactions than in 2022-23. Of the \$827.6m, residents and local businesses spent 68.5 per cent (\$568m) whilst visitors spent 31.5 per cent (\$260m).

If you are seeking a place to unwind, consider visiting Ganguddy-Dunns Swamp, a world heritage site located 25 kilometres east of Rylstone.
